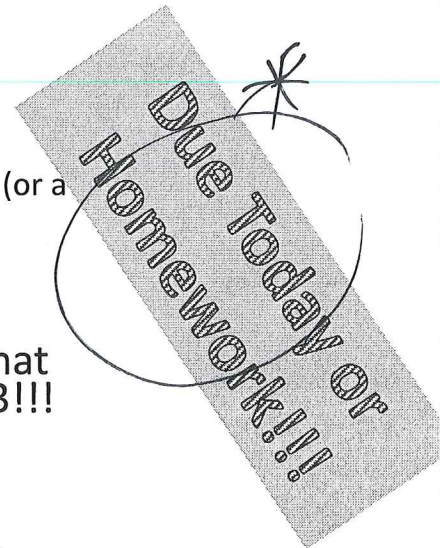

# ↓ "NOTES"

- At first, the Bill of Rights were meant for limiting the power of the newly created Federal Gov't (*remember, the states held all the people and each state had their own Bill of Rights...*) and therefore only applied to the Federal Gov't ... Not to the States!!!
- After Civil War, The 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment corrected state actions toward its own citizens and through this amendment (14<sup>th</sup>) the Federal Gov't was able to force the states to protect "Privileges/Immunities", "Due Process" & "Equal Protection".
- This application of Federal Liberties to the States is called:
- "**SELECTIVE INCORPORATION**" (the "Incorporation" means that the "States" were now included with the Federal Gov't and the "Selective" means that each Liberty had to be incorporated against the states on a case by case basis... (but most rights have been "...incorporated against the States")
